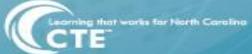

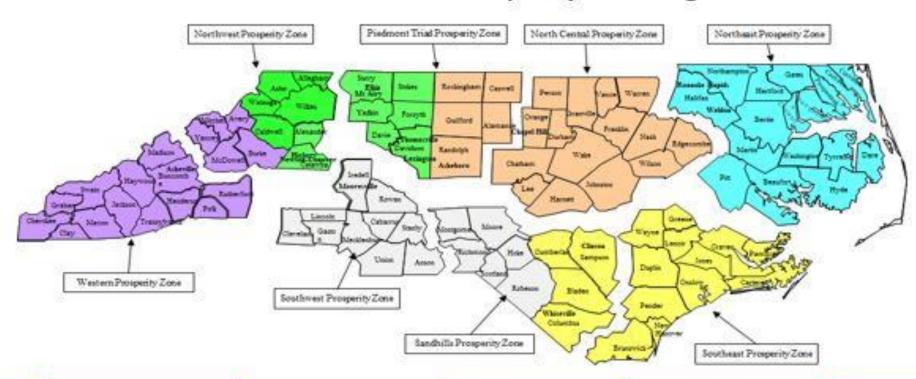

#### Career Development Coordinator 747

#### Based on master's degree in school counseling Effective July 1, 2012

#### Eligibility Requirements:

#### Degree

Master's degree in school counseling or career counseling and a clear license as a school counselor

#### Work Experience

 One year of industry-related career development work experience in business, industry, or labor within the past five years

#### OF

 One year as a coordinator of work-based learning (job shadowing, internships, cooperative education, apprenticeships) in a Career and Technical Education program area within the past five years

#### OF

. One year work experience in school counseling within the past five years

#### Clearing Specific Requirements:

Coursework

A total of 6 semester hours (to be completed in one school year) are required from the following

- Program planning and organization in Career and Technical Education
- Work-based learning organization

OR

Completion of the Career Development Facilitator (CDF) course available through the NC Workforce Development Training Center (in cooperation with NCDPI and NC Workforce Development Board)

Note: The CDF course will satisfy the 6 hour coursework requirement.

### Induction

The 10-hour New Career Development Coordinators/Special Populations Coordinators Induction Program approved by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction, Division of Career and Technical Education is required.

#### Primary Purpose of Position:

The primary purpose of this position is to provide and coordinate career development services to students in local schools and school systems.

### Description of Responsibilities:

The Career Development Coordinators (CDC) role is to support Career and Technical Education (CTE) and to coordinate career development services for students participating in CTE. The CDC works collaboratively with administrators, student services personnel, and teachers to ensure the delivery of career development services. CDCs facilitate linkages with parents, business/industry, postsecondary institutions, and community organizations to support students' transition to postsecondary education and employment.

The CDC responsibilities incorporate the North Carolina Standard Course of Study, National Career Development Guidelines, the National Model for School Counseling Programs and Future-Ready Students For the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. Specific Career Development Coordinator responsibilities are outlined as follows.

#### 1.00 CAREER DEVELOPMENT

- 1.01 Coordinate career development services.
- 1.02 Promote career awareness, exploration, and planning.
- 1.03 Provide career development, occupational, labor market, non-traditional career, and post secondary information.

#### 2.00 PREPARATORY SERVICES

- 2.01 Assists students with selection of appropriate academic and CTE courses.
- 2.02 Coordinate career planning activities in classrooms, groups, or individual sessions.
- 2.03 Provide and coordinate administration and interpretation of career assessments.
- 2.04 Provide information on postsecondary education programs and employment opportunities.

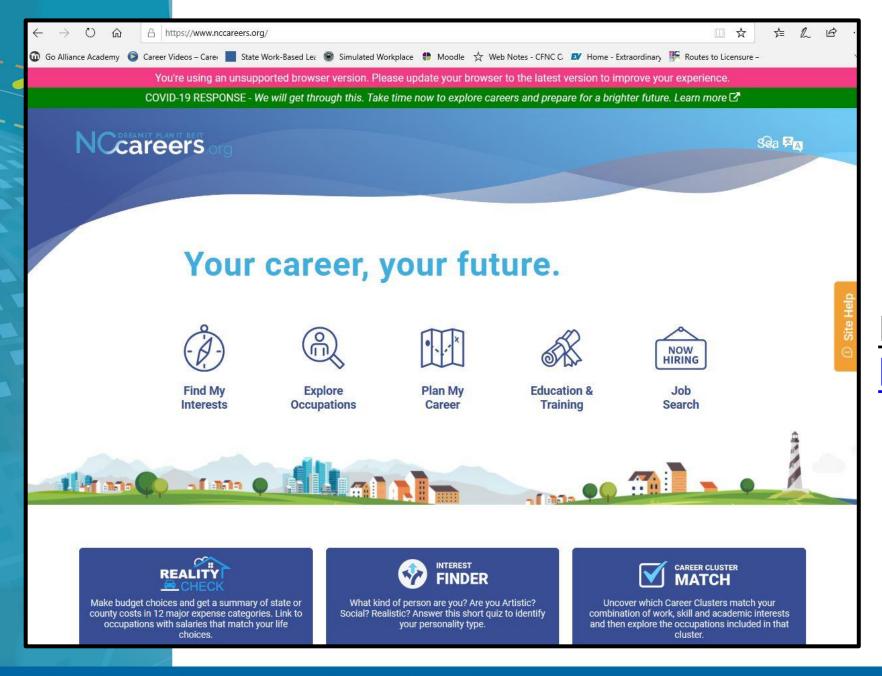

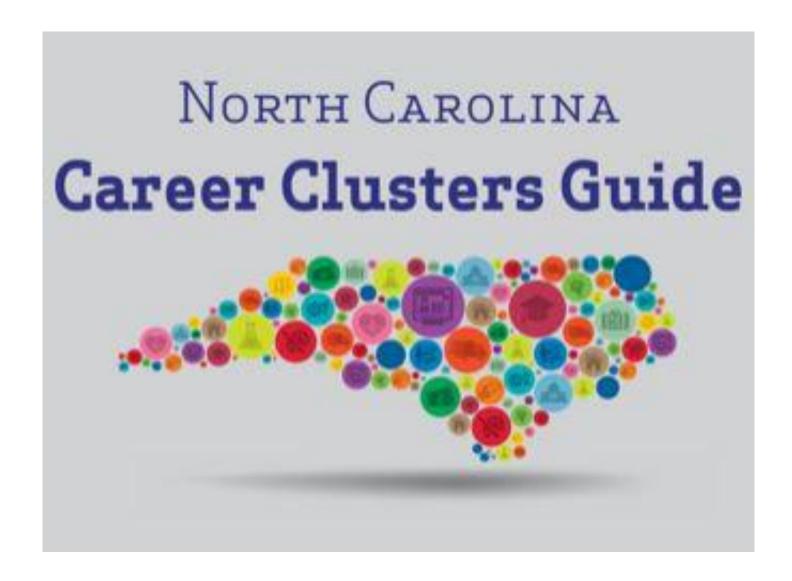
# 5th Grade Legislation

- Each local board of education is encouraged to implement a career awareness program for students in grade five to educate students on the career and technical education programs offered in the local school administrative unit.
- b) A local board of education that adopts a career awareness program for fifth grade students shall report on program activities and student outcomes from the prior school year to the State Board of Education by October 1 of each year.
- c) By November 15 of each year, the State Board shall submit a consolidated report to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee on program outcomes and any legislative recommendations based on local board of education reports.

WHEREAS, Career Development Coordinators assist high school students with career planning and empower them to make informed decisions regarding plans to further their education at a vocational program, community college or university, or pursue immediate employment in civilian or military occupations, and

WHEREAS, Career Development education enables career and technical education students to develop and apply critical thinking kills, interpersonal skills, leadership, and problem-solving skills, with business, global competition, information management, operations, supply and demand: and

WHEREAS, Career Development education contributes to increased attendance, raises achievement, improves graduation rates, and pares students for college, career and citizen readiness; and

WHEREAS, Career Development Coordinators assist students in understanding the 16 Career Clusters in the National Career Clusters Framework, representing more than 79 career pathways to help students navigate their way to greater success in college, career, and citizen readiness: and

WHEREAS, Career Development education is embedded in Career and Technical Education and integrated in all parts of the economy, contributing to the vibrancy and vitality of communities across North Carolina and our nation; and

WHEREAS, 2016 marks the historic 100th Anniversary of Career and Technical Education; and

WHEREAS, the National Career Development Association has declared November as the National Career Development Month, and November 16, 2016, as the National Career Development Day;
