Objectives

At the Institute, college teams will learn strategies and begin planning to

- 1. Lead institutional transformation through GPS principles and practices
- 2. Establish a culture of continuous inquiry and learning
- 3. Participate in a Networked Improvement Community (NIC)
- 4. Map program pathways
- 5. Assess status of GPS practices (Scale of Adoption Assessment)
- 6. Address achievement gaps for underserved students

A "flipped" version of a typical convening, the Institute will optimize our time learning and planning together in preparation for the phase one: mapping pathways.

Activities

The Institute will include a variety of active sessions for optimal learning and interaction in teams and across institutions. We are pleased to have the active participation of cohort colleges in leading conversations and sharing exemplary practices formally and informally. For example, Presidents **Bill Ingram** (Durham Tech), **Mary Rittling** (Davidson CCC), and **Pat Skinner** (Gaston College) will share insights about leading and empowering change, and **Beth Stewart** and **Steve Heulett** from Asheville-Buncombe Tech will share their nationally-recognized pathways project and will facilitate a workshop for cohort colleges.

Each college team will have multiple opportunities to share challenges and promising practices in leading change and mapping pathways.

On May 29, peer groups of those in similar roles will practice using improvement science tools led by NIC Facilitators and guests. During this time, presidents and System Office leaders will participate in a seminar, "Change Leadership for Guided Pathways," facilitated by Bob Templin and Keith Witham of the Aspen Institute.
